FAITH VACATION?



It is hard to believe that summer is right around the corner. As you may be wrapping up another faith formation year, we all know that forming ourselves in the faith and a relationship with Jesus Christ does not go on vacation! Below are some things to consider in equipping families to stay connected to Jesus this summer:

- Come up with a Summer Vacation Guidebook (physical and/or digital) with all of your parish opportunities for families and youth this summer. Make this available to your families, if possible, before the end of the Faith Formation year.
- Host parish leadership training(s) for catechists, leaders, and teens.
- Encourage families to pray together this summer. One resource you can point them to is The Praying Family at theprayingfamily.weebly.com where they can get ideas for setting up a prayer space in their home, download prayers, and sign up for email updates to purchase prayer kits.
- Develop a summer newsletter that goes beyond event opportunities, but also focuses on faith enrichment. Consider encouraging parents or teens to enrich their understanding of the Eucharist for the upcoming Eucharistic Revival by taking a Revive course at https://eucharisticrevival.org/, and maybe even start a study group that meets to discuss was learned.

DIVINE RENOVATION

You may be familiar with Divine Renovation through the book by Fr. James Mallon titled the same. Since the creation of that book, many parishes are rethinking their approach to ministry, and now Divine Renovation is more than a book, but is a ministry to parishes. They are hosting a conference July 18-20 in Dallas, TX and are offering discounts for parish teams of 4 or more.
