THE NECESSITY OF RETREAT



As church employees or volunteers, we are used to planning retreats and encouraging others to go on retreat, but we aren't always great about making time for ourselves to retreat.

Just as we won't find time to pray unless we make time to pray, we won't find time to retreat unless we make time to retreat. The Lord is inviting you to "come away with Him," whether that's physically going somewhere to be away from the hustle and bustle of the day or simply making time throughout your week to retreat. Perhaps there is a retreat or retreat-like experience listed in this issue that will perk your interest. That may be the Holy Spirit inviting you to consider registering (wink, wink).

If you are an introvert like me, there are many silent retreats available at various retreat centers nearby. THE PRAYING FAMILY

As Mother Teresa famously said, "The family who prays together stays together." The Office of Faith Formation and Youth Ministry and the Office of Life, Marriage, and Family are piloting a family prayer initiative inviting 3-5 parishes to partner with us.
